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## The President's Report

As I mentioned in our last newsletter, the turnout at the New York State meeting in Philadelphia in January was excellent, I hope to see as many of you at our annual conference and golf outing on June 3-5 at the Olympic Training Center in Lake Placid. It was great seeing so many students attending. Deanna Errico, our President-elect and the entire conference committee have put together another outstanding program for the membership.

On the financial front, NYSATA has been working closely with Lisa Quadrini, our financial advisor, in managing our accounts. We are looking to begin a more aggressive fundraising campaign, with a goal of raising money for future legislative efforts. I remain confident that our financial status will remain healthy



with whatever recommendations and decisions are made.

Chris Jones, who has been our Treasurer for many years, will be leaving his position with NYSATA. He is currently attending Physician Assistant school, and the demands of clinical rotations and his family obligations make it very difficult for

him to remain our treasurer. Chris has done an outstanding job with NYSATA, and will be missed. Good luck Chris.

District II is considering raising district dues \$10.00 due to the increased costs of business in the states, especially with legislative issues. This increase would stay in the states. We have been told that there would not be a NATA dues increase for a few years. We will discuss this at the NYSATA Executive Council meeting in June. District II will vote on this at the District II Business Meeting at the NATA Convention in New Orleans.

District II is also looking into a project called Communicate Activate Serve (CAS). This is a project that Mike Goldenberg, District II Director-Elect has created.

- The Communicate Section is a way for DII members to get information on the latest news from NATA and DII, and will include video messages, Skype, etc. Mike wants to also be able to Skype a message at our annual conference from DII. One of the thoughts is that members do not read messages, but respond better to visuals.
- The Activate Section is to mobilize members to serve. DII is looking to get 30 members to provide services.
- The Serve Section is to provide services. One of the ideas is to have an Advice council, where DII can provide advice to members on different subject areas (college issues, secondary school issues, licensing issues, reimbursement issues etc). We would get at least one person per state on each subject area, and that person would have to be a responsible person (get back to the complaint within 24-48 hours). DII also wants to have an Employer Educator Group. This group would provide information to employers about the athletic training profession.

Anyone interested in this project, especially the Serve Section, please let me or Deanna know. More information on CAS will be available soon.

NYSATA is going to develop a Facebook page. The Executive Council has approved this and will have Jenny Keough coordinate the Facebook page. Jenny Keough has been the New York State Student Delegate, Eastern Athletic Training Association. She is currently a Graduate Assistant Athletic Trainer at Cornell University, and received her B.S. in Athletic Training from Ithaca College in 2010. We will keep you posted on any updates.

Also, we are looking at using Skype as an opportunity to communicate with NYSATA members on NYSATA issues. We are currently holding Skype conference meetings with District II, and plan on doing the same with NYSATA members soon.

Our state association was well represented at the iLead Conference, the student leadership program held in Washington, DC in February in conjunction with our Capitol Hill Day efforts and the Athletic Training Educators' Conference. This was an opportunity to provide student members with valuable leadership skills and getting involved with the legislative process. Many thanks to Jessica Tau and Paul Cicero from Stony Brook University, Jonathan Grimmer from Marist College, and Alyssa Sotomayer from Ithaca College for representing New York. Jennie Petrone, Tracye Martin, and I participated in the Capitol Hill efforts, along with the students. We all felt that our meetings with the legislators went well.

The Athletic Training Board was scheduled to meet on Monday April 25, 2011 at West Point. Issues to be discussed were to include the role of the certified athletic trainer in concussion legislation, unregistered athletic trainers, and the massage therapist (calling himself an athletic trainer) on Long Island. We will keep you posted of the results of that meeting.

We are starting to finalize plans for our state delegation to attend Lobby Day in Albany. The date selected this year is Tuesday, May 24, 2011. We will have the opportunity to meet with our legislators to discuss issues important to the association and our profession. Christine Jenkins, our Governmental Affairs Committee Chair, is working on projects like the NYS Concussion Bill, NYS Lobby Day, and with other activities with District II and our lobbyist. Please contact Christine if you are interested in participating at Lobby Day.

NYSATA is looking into partnering with the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society (PATS), the Athletic Trainers Society of New Jersey (ATSNJ), and the Delaware Athletic Training Association (DATA) to film commercial. We met with a production company in Philadelphia, and we are looking forward to this production. We agreed that we did not want to rush this project, and make sure that it is one that we can all be proud of.

The Executive Council voted on having a professional company develop and manage our website. We felt that having a professional company manage our website would keep us on the cutting edge of technology, which is so important with getting information to our membership. We signed a contract with the Ithaca Website Design Company on March 2, 2011. We would like everyone to check it out at [www.gonysata2.org](http://www.gonysata2.org). We would like to thank Kerry Maroney for all of her help over the past few years working on the website. It is a very difficult job, and involves a lot of time and effort. We need to be proud of the Athletic Training profession in NY State. Athletic trainers are recognized by the NY State Education Department (NYSED) Office of the Professions as a licensed profession. Only people that are registered with the Office of the Professions can call themselves certified athletic trainers in NY State. We ask that all certified athletic trainers in NYS register with NYSED. We have sent out numerous emails reminding certified athletic trainers to register with NYSED. ## NYSATA Legislative Update

### Senate Health Committee Chair Takes on Head Injuries

Senator Kemp Hannon (R, Garden City) has introduced a bill that will require the implementation of procedures in schools to address head injuries (S.3953-A). Senator Hannon has been concerned about the management of youth head injuries for many years, holding the Health Committee chairmanship as well as being personally interested in the issue as the father of lacrosse players. The movement for legislation that would address head injuries in schools is a strong one and increasing public pressure and media attention has pushed this issue into the forefront. Senator Hannon has already held a press conference on this legislation with members of the Sarah Jane Brain Foundation as well as Senators Greg Ball (R, Brewster) and Lee Zeldin (R, Hauppauge).

Senator Hannon's bill would require school districts to establish a concussion management team made up of school medical personnel, including athletic trainers, and coaches. The concussion management team would be charged with implementing the procedures and establishing specific courses of action for management of head injuries and the return to school, activity, and participation in sports for the student, if applicable, as the legislation is not limited to pupils who participate in sports.

The legislation establishes a panel of experts to assist the State Education Department in promulgating regulations regarding more specifics. This panel of experts includes Certified Athletic Trainers, the New York State Public High School Athletic Association, public and nonpublic school interscholastic sports coaches, and public school medical and health professionals. Participation on this panel of experts that will be involved in promulgating regulations on the care and treatment of head injuries will provide Certified Athletic Trainers a statewide opportunity to impact the head injury policies in all schools.

In discussions with Senator Hannon and his staff, it is clear that they understand the unique qualifications and experience that Certified Athletic Trainers possess. ATCs are involved in many aspects of the bill, a quality that we are continuing to work to maintain. ATCs are represented in the statewide group that will impact the regulations and are listed as qualified members of the concussion teams that will be established in every school in the State.

Also, the legislation requires medical personnel, including Certified Athletic Trainers, to complete biennial training which probably includes the training ATCs already complete as continuing education/competencies. Wilson Elser is working to ensure this is understood and carried through to the regulations to make certain there is no duplicative burden on ATCs.

In supporting this piece of legislation now by working with the Legislature and the SED should it become law, Certified Athletic Trainers are in a very good position to advance their profession in the future in multiple ways as the most appropriate professionals to manage head injuries. Wilson Elser recognizes this opportunity for Certified Athletic Trainers and looks forward to the work ahead to ensure an improvement of the management of head injuries.

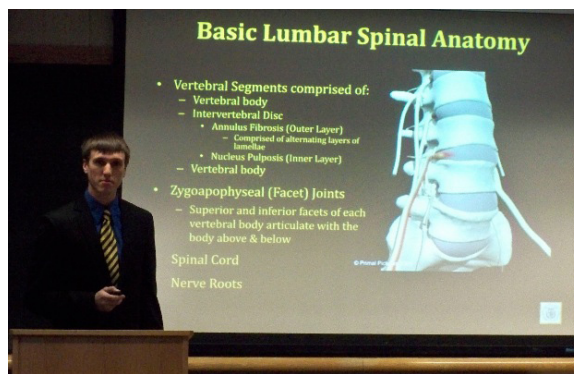
*Dominican College* also participated in NATM by setting up signs and distributing material on Athletic Training and common injuries.

As we approach this spring and summer, the first priority regarding Governmental Affairs is our annual **LOBBY DAY** in Albany.

Everyone by now should have received information about Lobby Day through email. Here is the information again in case the email got lost in your inbox:

It will be held *Tuesday, May 24<sup>th</sup> 2011*, at the State Capital in Albany. The time is TBA but typically runs from approximately 9:00AM - 4:00PM (we welcome your help during any or all parts of the day).

The general format remains the same as in previous years. We will meet with State Legislators involved in bills pertaining to ATCs, drop off information packets to Legislators, and staff an informative display designed to educate lawmakers about who we are and what we do.

This Year's Theme is "**Certified Athletic Trainers ARE the appropriate Professionals to manage athletic injuries, including mild traumatic brain injuries, in the physically active**".

I realize everyone is busy and we often have twenty things pulling at us from different directions. But, keep in mind that this may very well be the most important day out of the year for NYSATA and the future of Athletic Training in New York! It is one day out of the year and the event will be more successful as more and more people attend!

**What else is new?** As you can see from the theme of this year's Lobby Day, the primary focus of Governmental Affairs continues to be Public Safety legislation. Most importantly, getting Athletic Trainers recognized and written into the current bills in the legislature.

There have been a lot of ebbs and flows in the activity of Concussion legislation in the State Capital. The previous bill supported by Representative Maziarz is no longer on the docket. The bill we are focusing on now is written by Representative Hannon and includes much of the same language as previous bills relating to head injury management.

Although Hannon's bill is more ATC-friendly, we remain in constant communication with them to push for more ATC involvement.

## Secondary School Committee

Paul Lasinski, ATC

- The committee recently reviewed Senator Hannon's Concussion Bill and forwarded suggestions on the language of the bill to Chris Hobler who passed them along to our lobbyist. The focus of the NYSATA will be to ensure that the Bill includes the certified athletic trainer as an integral part of the Concussion Management Team.
- The following is from the on-line newsletter NATA Range of Motion: *With school districts across the country experiencing troubling budget cuts, NATA has launched a new online resource page to help athletic trainers protect their jobs. The new section of the website offers strategies and resources aimed at educating decision makers on the importance of the athletic trainer in any school athletics program. The website is [www.nata.org/State-Budget-Crisis](http://www.nata.org/State-Budget-Crisis)*
- Paul Lasinski took part in the recent NYSPHSAA Safety Committee Meeting. Highlights of the meeting that were germane to ATCs are as follows:
  - The committee voted to (on the recommendation of the wrestling committee) to discontinue Hydrostatic Weighing as part of the appeal go into effect in 2011-12.
  - The committee voiced strong support of certified athletic trainers being an integral part of the School District's Concussion Management Team.
  - The NYSPHSAA Safety Committee and the NYSPHSAA Girls Lacrosse Committee have worked together to try and improve the accuracy of injury survey for girls lacrosse in New York State. They are asking that coaches and certified athletic trainers work together to complete the injury survey.
