NATM is a concentrated effort to provide information to the public about athletic trainers. I have to say that I am so proud of our members that have been working tirelessly to do so for the past 10+ years as we have been attempting to obtain licensure and to improve working conditions and salaries. I want you to know that it is working. I have been attending lobby day for NYSATA since I became a NYSATA member, and this year was definitely different from years past. We are being heard, our importance is being recognized, and there are no longer doubts...there IS an AT for That!

So thank you to everyone who has paved the way for what is to come. Continue to educATe, advocATe, and be passionATe not only during NATM, but throughout the year. I am optimistic for our future as athletic trainers in NY and I have nothing but confidence to always respond with "There's an AT for that!"

Governmental Affairs Report

We are in the midst of the legislative session and even though the budget took much longer than usual this year, we are still very hopeful that things will bounce back and all the legislative work we have done up to now will allow for our AT licensure bill (A219 – Sponsor Solages and S942 – Sponsor Bailey) to make it to the agenda of the Higher Ed committees of both the assembly and senate. Following amendments, you should expect to see an "A" version for both bills to come out in May. Be ready to call your legislators once we have the amendments and the bills start moving.

#### **Lobby Day**

Lobby Day was held on April 25, 2023 with about a dozen NYSATA members participating. While the legislators were still caught up in budget negotiations, we had opportunities to meet with the actual assembly member or senator in most of our 20 scheduled meetings

and had very positive feedback.

#### **AT Saves**

NYSATA GA supplemented Assemblywoman Solages' plan to recognize the athletic trainers from the Buffalo Bills for their heroic save of Damar Hamlin by bringing ATs from around the state, who have also made saves. Eight of these ATs, along with Denny Kellington and Nate Breske, also spoke at the March 29 press event "ATs Save" and it was a great success in showing that AT saves do not just happen on the national stage, but in our schools and colleges in NYS. This also helped to educate the public and promote our legislation.

#### **Healthcare Workers Bonus**

We worked very hard with our lobbyist to promote ATs to be on the list to receive the NYS Healthcare Workers Bonus. However, there is a long list of other healthcare workers who also were not on the list, making it difficult to grant this to us. For those who work in healthcare facilities, you should be eligible, for those working in schools, it may be difficult for you to get this bonus.

### Concussion Outreach Prevention & Education (COPE)

This is a grant collaboratively requested by NYSATA and BIANYS (Brain Injury Association of New York State) and secured through Senator Hoylman last year (he allocated \$10,000 last year to us) so that we could initiate the COPE program – providing educational programs for communities with youth sports to learn about concussion. This year we requested \$175,000 grant funding, which will come through the budget, again in conjunction with BIANYS. We should know soon if we get this and then we can provide educational sessions throughout the state.

#### **Concussion Law**

BIANYS and our NYSATA representative (Aimee Brunelle) continue to work together to improve the current law with the **Concussion Management and Awareness Act Update**. We are hopeful that it will pass this year.

CPR bill - NYSATA has been working with Assemblyman Santabarbara, to put forth a CPR Bill that will require all youth coaches to be CPR and AED certified.



# NYSATA Legislative Update Karin Carreau, Carreau Consultina

After a 27-day long stalemate, Governor Kathy Hochul finally announced on April 27, that there is conceptual agreement on a \$229 billion budget. The Governor made the declaration from the capitol and in doing so, broke with tradition that would have had the Senate and Assembly leaders at her side. Reportedly, lawmakers, who had again extended their weekly session calendars have returned to their districts, and as of drafting of this article, no budget bills were yet printed.

The governors report on the framework noted the final deal will include a third round of changes to the state's bail laws that were enacted in 2019, however, it will not include the Governor's proposal to change the laws on discovery. We can expect language to be included that is designed to crack down on illegal marijuana retailers and while details are sparse, it is said to be aggressive in its attempts to penalize those sellers who are not paying taxes. After a long-fought battle, the final plan will include a plan to raise the minimum wage to \$17 an hour, starting with \$16 an hour next year in New York City, and then indexing it to inflation within a few years. Reports also note that it will also include "the largest Medicaid rate increase in two decades," and what the Governor referred to as "critical policy changes" in the area of mental health. Notably the final budget is not expected to include much language on housing after the Governor's proposal dissolved last week amid strong opposition. It is also not expected to include an expansion of eligible professions for the states covid related workforce bonuses.

In closing, the Governor asked the question "Did we accomplish what this moment called for?" "Did we make a difference in the lives of New Yorkers? We are going to be able to answer that question yes."

What does all of this mean to NYSATA and our legislative efforts? First and foremost, we are greatly relieved that the legislature can now focus on issues not related to the budget. Given their budget negotiations ran nearly a month late, it means the non-fiscal part of the session has been extremely truncated and all of our legislative priorities (see Government Affairs article) will have to come together in mere weeks, as opposed to the nearly two and a half months we had anticipated. It is with that in mind that we ask you to once again, be ready to engage and help us amplify our voices to advance our priority issues and if you have not yet reached out to your Senate and/or Assembly member to ask for their support on our bills, please do so.

social media takeover day in recognition of NATM. (Pictured right)




